

Jennifer Jones, Olympic Gold Medalist 2014



Jennifer is Canada's most decorated and recognizable female curling athlete. She is the skip of the 2014 Olympic Gold Medal winning team who set an Olympic Record when they went undefeated en route to the Gold Medal!

It has been widely publicized that Team Jones' performance at the Olympics in Sochi, Russia has set a new standard for women's curling.

Jennifer is a four time Canadian Women's Curling Champion, the 2008 World Women's Curling Champion, and the 2010 World Women's bronze medalist. She also joined the media bench as a reporter for Yahoo! Sports at the Vancouver 2010 Olympics.

Jennifer is a graduate of the University of Manitoba where she completed her Bachelor of Laws Degree in 1999 and has been a member of the Manitoba Bar since 2000.

Jennifer is a natural leader and her aggressive strategy has changed the face of women's curling. She is known for being one of the best pressure players to ever compete in curling and best known for making "The Shot" – a last rock "in-off" shot to win her first Tournament of Hearts in 2005. "The Shot" is labelled by many sports commentators to be the greatest shot to win a curling championship.
